Legal protections legislate for equitable access to essential services⁴ necessary for full child well-being, survival and development; eliminate barriers to access; provide a protective environment and enforce measures to restore full access to services for children who face limitations in access. In the prism of child well-being therefore legal protection is neither a stand-alone nor an end in itself; but an integral part of essential services for child well-being.
